



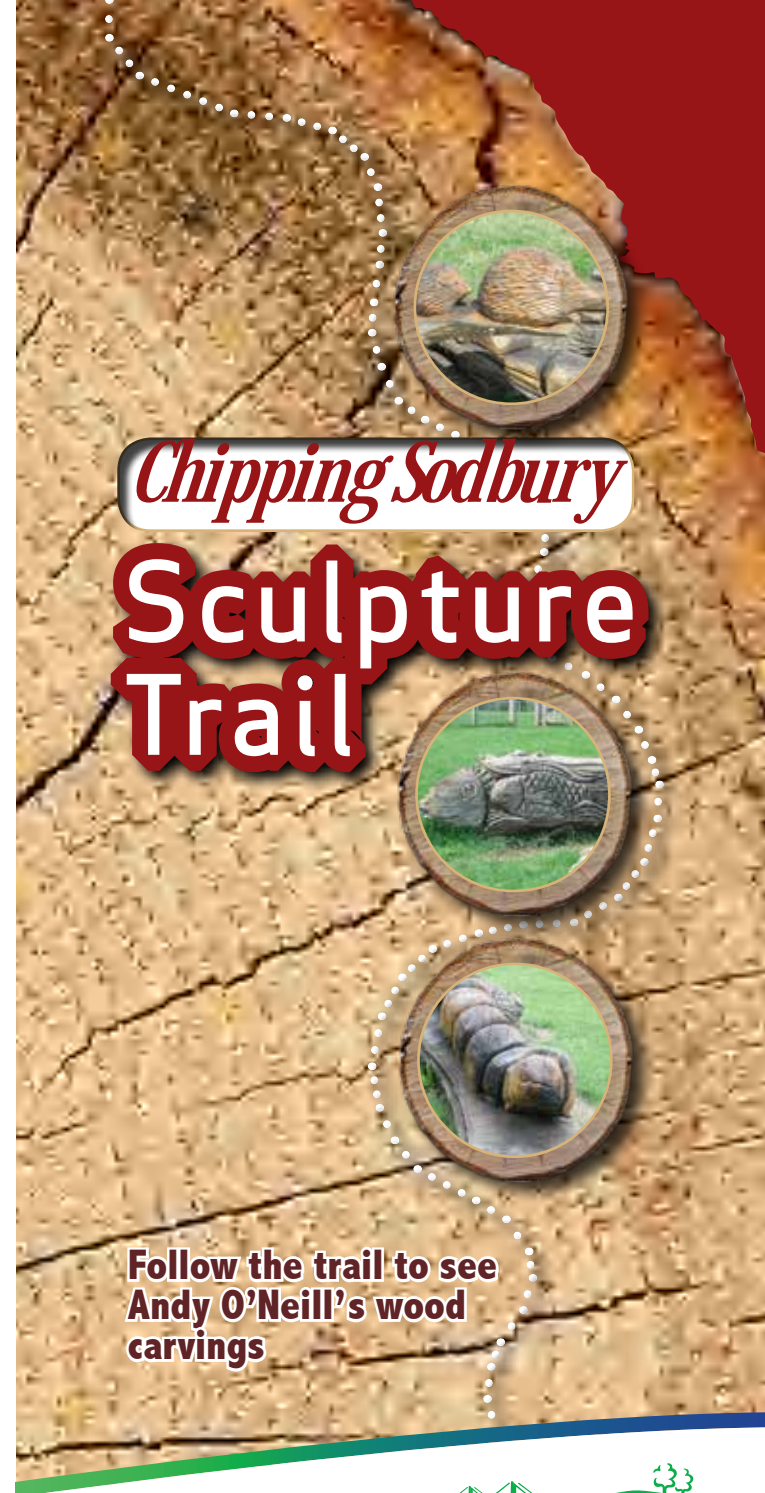

Follow the trail to see
Andy O'Neill's wood
carvings

Chipping Sodbury Sculpture Trail

The trail starts from Wickwar Road Car Park in Chipping Sodbury. Follow the path close to the river towards St Johns Church.

All the carvings are by Andy O'Neill -
" I have been a full time wood carver for the past 7 years and thoroughly enjoy it. I have been very lucky in having the support of my local authority, Janes Pond Landscaping and Lawrence Tree Services who have been kind enough to commission me for various projects within my local community. I hope that you have fun exploring the local area and discovering my work".

1 Follow the path to St Johns Church where you will see the **Angel** carving.



2 Retrace your footsteps to the pedestrian crossing, cross and go straight ahead to the footpath along the river. Look out for the **Frog** carving on your left.



5 Go up the steps on your left and along Couzens Close. At the T junction turn left on to the signposted public footpath on the right. On your left you will see the **Caterpillar** carving.



4 With Snake carving on your left, take the footpath to the right down towards the river to see the **Woodlouse** carving on your left.



3 With the frog on your left follow the footpath close to the river and look out for the **Snake, Hegehogs and Kingfisher** carving.



6 Continue on the path to just before a small bridge where you will see the **Bee** carving on your left.



7 Go across the grass on your left until you reach St Johns Way, turn left into Couzens Close bearing right until you see a footpath next to number 84. A few metres along this path you will see the **Ladybird** carving on your right.



8 Go back to Couzens Close, turn left and go along pavement opposite taking you back to Wickwar Rd. Just before you reach the road you will pass the Community Orchard. Go right into the orchard to see the **Apple** carving. Be careful not to go too close to wicker fence as it encloses bee hives and they may fly out!



9 When you leave the orchard, turn right and within a few metres behind some trees you will see the **Badger** carving.
